2013 Employment Report

iSchool Career Services

Summary

In June 2013, the University of Toronto iSchool conducted a survey with the Master of Information (MI), Master of Museum Studies (MMSt), and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) alumni, who graduated in June 2012, March 2012, and November 2011. The collected statistics and feedback were used to inform the faculty of the alumni's professional progress and assist with future planning. This report summarizes the employment data, which illustrates the alumni's career outcomes 12 months after graduation.


Of the 187 MI and MMSt alumni, 77 (41%) respondents completed the employment survey, with slightly higher representation from the MI program (42%) than the MMSt program (37%).

The key results include:


- ◆ 86% of MI and MMSt alumni were employed 12 months after graduation
- ◆ Of the employed, 86% of MI alumni and 83% of MMSt alumni were in full-time roles that are closely or somewhat closely related to their studies
- ◆ Over two-thirds of MI and MMSt respondents found jobs prior to graduation or up to 6 months after graduation
- ◆ Two-thirds of employed MI alumni (64%) as well as MMSt alumni (75%) were employed in permanent roles
- ◆ Networking/personal contacts as a job search method was the most effective way of securing employment, followed by online job boards and the iSchool Job Site
- ◆ The average (i.e. mean) annual salary for full-time employed MI alumni was \$54,000, while the average annual salary for MMSt alumni with full-time jobs was \$37,000
- ◆ Majority of alumni found jobs in Toronto (GTA) Ontario or in Ontario – outside of the GTA
- ◆ Alumni found employment in a wide variety of sectors and organizations

The next annual employment survey will be conducted in June 2014 with the graduating class of November 2012 and June 2013.

Employment Status



Out of 64 MI respondents, 86% were employed 12 months after graduation.




Similarly, out of 14 MMSt respondents, 86% were employed 12 months after graduation.


Majority of MI (86%) and MMSt (83%) alumni were holding full-time positions in a closely or somewhat closely related field to their studies.

Respondents also indicated they found employment primarily within the Greater Toronto Area (GTA), followed by Ontario – outside of the GTA, and outside of Canada.

Additionally, two-thirds of employed MI alumni (64%) as well as MMSt alumni (75%) were employed in permanent roles.




The trend of initially hiring employees on contract basis, which would lead to more permanent roles, continues as employers are trying to find ways to select and keep the best candidates: "In addition, temporary employment also offers both employers and employees a chance to test the waters prior to making a permanent commitment." *



Job Search



Over two-thirds of respondents were successful in securing employment prior to or within the first six months after graduation, and over 20% of MI alumni went to their graduation with a job offer in hand. However, successful job search is attributed to a variety of factors, including being proactive and starting to search for employment early, well before graduation, and using a variety of methods, rather than relying solely on job postings.



The respondents have identified that networking or personal contacts assisted them in securing jobs, but also searching for job ads on organizations' job boards and the iSchool's job site. Furthermore, obtaining relevant employment in a timely manner also depends on the type of organization, recruitment cycles, geographic limitations, as well as the economic state of the region.

Law firms, academic institutions, start-ups, government institutions, business and financial corporations, public libraries, museums, galleries and almost all types of organizations are hiring iSchool graduates. Considering the unique advantage of the iSchool programs, where students can create their own path and tailor the program to their needs and interests, alumni were able to find or create their own roles in all types of organizations and sectors.



Average Salary

The average annual salaries reported for full-time positions ranged from \$30,000 to \$100,000. For the MMSt graduates, the average or mean salary was \$37,000, which is similar to last year's results. For the MI alumni, the average or mean salary was \$54,000. The median salary for MI alumni was \$55,000, while the mode, the one most often listed, was \$65,000.

Salaries are determined by many factors, including the economy, candidate's previous experience, and the level of the position. Furthermore, the iSchool graduates tend to evaluate job offers not just based on salaries, but rather the type of organization and potential for career growth. Other aspects, such as type of work, location, work-life balance, benefits and organizational culture play significant roles in both searching for work and accepting job offers.

We thank all the alumni, who completed the survey and shared their employment data with us. The next survey is scheduled for June 2014 and will be sent via email to November 2012 and June 2013 iSchool graduates. The results will be available in Fall 2014.
